
Sequencing

Sequencing is about putting things in order – what comes first, then next and last – especially in being able to tell a story or recall information to tell someone else.

This week we will work on putting pictures in order to make a story and also using sequencing in things we do at home every day.



In this example the story would be something like

- First you get some milk from the fridge
- Then you pour it into a glass
- Last you drink it

I have sent a pack of sequencing pictures you can use – give your child the 3 pictures randomly and ask them to put them in the right order and then tell the story using First/Then or Next/ Last

Some other activities to try :-

- As they get dressed ask them to say what comes first/nest/last
- Ask them to tell you the sequence of how to brush your teeth- 3 parts
- Ask them to do a getting ready for bed sequence eg. pyjamas on / story / sleep
- Make a jam sandwich and talk about what we need to do first/next/last
- Make a jig -so get them to draw a picture, cut it into squares and re-build it talking about what we need first/then what/and last
- Go for a walk and ask them to try to find 3 things a leaf / a flower / a feather
- Read stories and talk about what happened and what will happen next re-tell the story just with the pictures
- Draw a picture of their favourite part of a movie then ask them to say what happens in the story in 3 simple parts
- Daily diary what we did today draw a picture and then 3 sentences to copy what we did first/next /last
- On Google you can search for 3 part sequences in the images there are lots on there
- If they fall or argue with their siblings ask them to say what happened in order so that they can give clear information that an adult can use.
